KEYNOTE SPEAKER



JUSTIN ROMACK

"Oh, the Places You'll Go: Fostering Strength, Confidence and Creativity with Disabled Youth and Young Adults"

Society seems convinced living life with a disability is tragic, unfulfilling and burdensome, which can often influence opportunities and expectations for youth and young adults looking to explore the world and how they will contribute to it. In this talk, Justin Romack will share how he's worked to reclaim the narrative on disability and use his blindness as a catalyst for the value he brings to his family, workplace and community involvement, and the ways he coaches, consults and advises disabled youth and young adults to understand their disability and the many strengths they possess.

Justin Romack is an Assistant Director with the Department of Disability Resources at Texas A&M University, where he works with faculty, staff and students to promote equitable access to the Aggie experience for disabled students. After losing his eyesight as a college student in 2008, Justin's skills as a communicator and educator were enhanced through resilience, creativity and courage as he found new ways to explore

the world without his vision. Justin has two decades of experience working with assistive technology, technical accessibility and disability education, where he works with students, teachers, businesses and anyone else who will listen about how to ensure what we do, construct and create is accessible to everyone. Justin has a bachelor's degree in Communications from Stephen F. Austin State University and is currently a graduate student in the Higher Education Administration program at Texas A&M University. He has served on the board of directors for the Assistive Technology in Higher Education Network and the regional affiliate of the Association on Higher Education and Disability, and earned the distinction as a Certified Professional in Accessibility Core Competencies from the International Association of Accessibility Professionals.

Ability Amplified: Essential Skills for Successful Long-term Employment

Beth Sherry is the Project SEARCH instructor for College Station ISD, which is a program that prepares young people with significant disabilities for success in competitive integrated employment. In the Project SEARCH program, participants complete internships at Baylor Scott & White Hospital where Beth works closely with hospital staff, mentors, and supervisors to ensure that students are learning the skills needed to gain and maintain employment.

Building Blocks: Strategies for Supporting Special Needs Across the Lifespan

In this session, participants will receive resources to support their child with special needs throughout various life stages, spanning from infancy to adulthood. The content encompasses practical checklists, effective best practices, and instructional methods tailored to foster skills in choice and decision-making, goal setting, self-awareness, and self-determination.

Brynn Biggs serves as the Project Manager for the Texas Education Agency's (TEA) Student-Centered Transitions Network, based at Sam Houston State University's Garrett Center. Holding an undergraduate degree in Special Education and a master's degree in educational psychology.

With over twelve years of experience in Texas public schools, Brynn has held diverse roles, including secondary special education teacher, transition coordinator, and 18+ Programs Instructional Coach. Her expertise extends to facilitating professional development at district, state, and national levels, covering various transition-related topics.

- Examine the different eligibility standards between title 2 and supplemental security income (SSI);
- Explain the process and impact on SSA benefits when a student turns 18;
- Contrast the differences between Medicare and Medicaid;
- Guide the process to utilize SSA work incentives and maximize benefits; and
- Alleviate fears of loss of benefits by clarifying myths and explaining misinformation.

Sandy Hardy-Smith is the Chief Operations Officer for Benefits and Employment Services with Imagine Enterprises. With over 45 years working in the field of disability. She has 30+ years in community-based employment services and 25 years training on Social Security benefits.

Sandy directs Imagine Enterprises' Work Incentive Planning & Assistance (WIPA) in 53 counties in Texas; a Statewide Employment Network (EN) initiative; partnership with the Texas Workforce Commission-Vocational Rehabilitation (TWC-VR) statewide referrals for benefits counseling, employment and self employment services, and Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS); Self-Determination Initiative with the University of Kansas, and in partnership with TWC-VR and UNTWISE under the Beacons of Excellence. Come learn about the Texas Achieving A Better Life Experience (Texas ABLE®) program and how Texans with disabilities and their families can save for disability -related expenses in a tax-advantaged ABLE account without losing eligibility for certain public benefits, such as Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Medicaid. Texas ABLE is based on federal and state legislation and is maintained by the state through the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts. Funds in an ABLE account can be used to pay for qualified disability expenses that relate to the beneficiary's blindness or disability and are used to maintain or improve his or her health, independence or quality of life.

Raising Awareness of Developmental Language Disorder

Developmental Language Disorder (DLD) is the new term to replace Specific Language Impairment (SLI). Developmental Language Disorder is diagnosed when children fail to acquire their own language for no obvious reason. This results in children who have difficulty understanding what people say to them, and struggle to articulate their ideas and feelings. Recent research has shown that, on average, 2 children in every class of 30 will experience DLD severe enough to hinder academic progress.

In 2017, the first DLD awareness campaign was introduced with the theme DLD 1-2-3 highlighting (1) DLD is a problem with speaking and/or listening, (2) it is hidden but common, and (3) support can help to improve the quality of life of affected children and their families.
